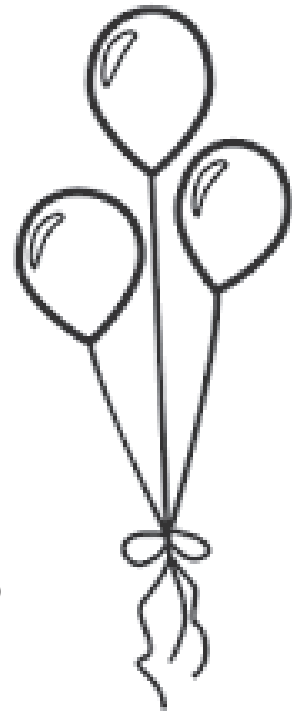
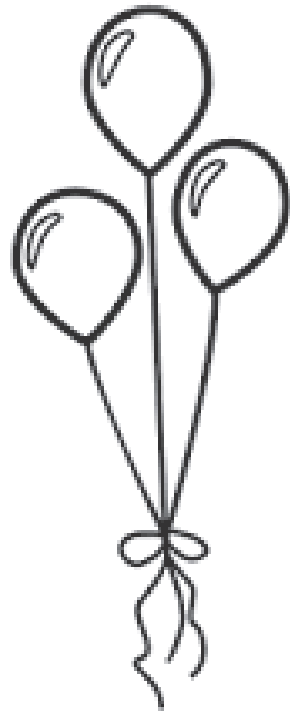

As we begin a new year, it seems necessary to address rumors. I am speaking first about the rumor that Shriners Hospitals for Children — Cincinnati is closing. Simply: It is NOT true.

Another dangerous rumor going around is that our temples and clubs should no longer bring new patients to Cincinnati. **Nothing could be further from the truth.** Our Cincinnati hospital continues to be the premier pediatric specialty care facility in the Central Region, and it is our responsibility as Shriners to insure that we provide this care to any child that needs it.

Let me share a few facts about Cincinnati Shriners Hospital:

- Cincinnati Shriners Hospital is one of the system's top revenue collectors from both public and private insurance.
- It has the lowest draw on the endowment of our four burn hospitals, and is one of the highest fundraising performers in the system, exceeding its 2018 goal by almost 50%.
- At the same time, our Cincinnati hospital ended 2018 significantly under budget.
- 2018 admissions and outpatient treatments were steady and surgical numbers only slightly down from 2017.
- The hospital added two new plastic surgeons in 2018, and is in the process of hiring another burn surgeon for 2019.

As I said in my November message, there are system-wide adjustments taking place to ensure that Shriners Hospitals' superior care is available now and in the future. In Cincinnati, we are in talks with local hospital systems to explore partnerships.

Cincinnati Shriners Hospital remains a vital leader in cutting-edge pediatric treatment and research. For 50 years, it has been the region's premier destination for life-saving treatment to those most vulnerable.

YOU are responsible for the future of Cincinnati Shriners Hospital.

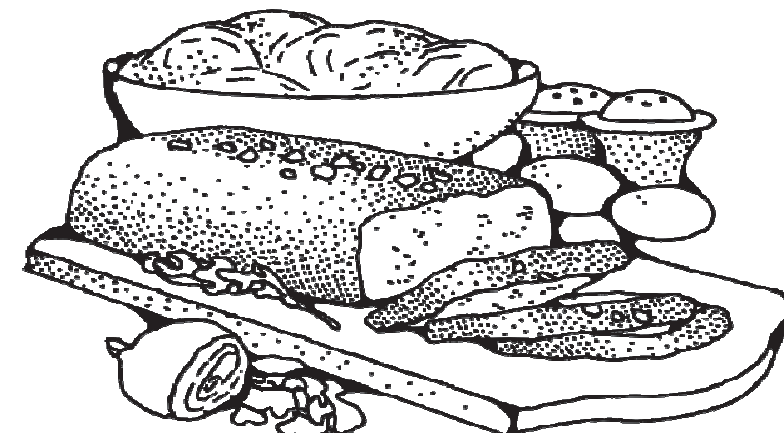

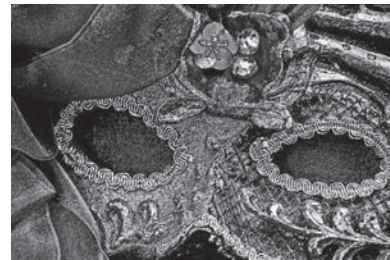
Looking forward to a FUN year and our Unit is always there when you need us.

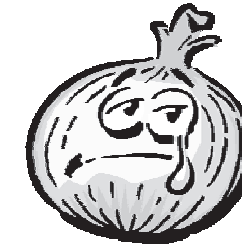
